MOMENT FOR MISSION: Tenacious Grace

Under the direction of Cookie Cawthon, Tenacious Grace exists to engage hurting women from all walks of life with the message of truth, strength, and hope in Jesus. One aspect of that mission involves building relationships with women during their incarceration at the Florence County Detention Center, sharing Jesus with them at a time of great hopelessness. Tenacious Grace offers many of those women an opportunity to apply to Five Sparrows, a free, two-year recovery residence; this affords them the opportunity – after their release – to continue growing in their relationship with Jesus in an environment conducive to the gospel. Keep in mind, these residents are survivors of abuse, addiction, poverty, and prostitution. The Five Sparrows house gives them the time and space to heal and grow into the women God made them to be. They receive safe housing, medical, dental, and vision care, recovery services, job training, educational opportunities, trauma counseling, life skills, and spiritual growth opportunities at no cost to themselves. Cookie says, "We are blessed to share the love and grace and provision of Jesus and then watch Him save and change the women we serve. Because a resident is freed from the relational, financial and environmental stresses of her past, she is able to begin writing a new story with Iesus."


Dear Church Family,

In our Wednesday nights together we have been enjoying fellowship as we have been studying the Lord's Prayer together. After we finish with studying The Prayer, we are going to have some special opportunities coming up. In particular, please mark down March 22 on your calendar. On that Wednesday night, the 5:30 p.m. dinner will be from Holt Brothers and proceeds will go to benefit our ministry partner Lighthouse Ministries. This is another way to reach out in missions while enjoying great food. As you may know, Lighthouse is a longtime partner that FPC helped launch years ago. One of our own church officers, Daniel Jordan, has done a fine job chairing their board for some time. He is always eager to talk about Lighthouse and answer any questions you may have about it.

After dinner, from 6:15 to 7:15 p.m. everyone will meet in the sanctuary for a prayer gathering. I am very excited to say that Bill and I are working with three other pastors in town. They and members of their congregations will join us that evening as we all seek the Lord together. We are working on the details and praying about this upcoming service now, and I ask you to join us in prayer as well. May we be open to something new. We all sense the call to worship the Lord together, and we are excited to see what God will do. How wonderful would it be to see, as the prophet Isaiah says, for all the nations to stream into the House of the Lord (2:2)! Building relationships in and among the congregations through fellowship and prayer is the source of great joy.

Finally, during this season of Lent leading up to Easter, it is common practice for Christians to either give up a



routine or take up a new habit in order to help cultivate an awareness of the Lord's presence with us. As such, we will explore together Ephesians 6 and the "Full Armor of God" in our sermon series. Far from spiritual warfare being "really weird," we will see how intensely practical the rhythms of "putting on the armor" is to our daily lives. I am ever fascinated with how the Lord continually reveals new things to us through His Word.

Frequently we hear the phrase, "WWJD" - meaning, "What Would Jesus Do?" It implies: let us think what Jesus would do, and then do the same thing. Yet, I prefer "WIJD" - "What is Jesus Doing?" It takes the pressure off us performing, while centering our gaze on Him. There is always a "newness" to what He is doing. It means we may not do things "like we have always done them." March 22, ECO, Lent ... what do you sense God is up to?

The Secret of Lifelong Fulfillment

THE REAL SECRET OF LIFELONG FULFILLMENT

... there it was in big, bold, black letters. An article in the Wall Street Journal proclaimed the "open secret." What is this secret? How can you and I experience a life of fulfillment?

The answer should not shock you—PERSONAL CON-NECTIONS. "Personal Connections," so the article proclaimed, "are the most important factor in long-term health and happiness." That's not a new insight but based on an 85-year ongoing Harvard University study of adult development.

With all respect to the *Wall Street Journal* and Harvard, long before they existed the Bible identified relationships as the essential foundation for a life of purpose. The biblical phrase is "one another." At least 59 times (count 'em) the Bible calls us to "one another." "Love one another." "Forgive one another." "Be kind to one another." "Do what is good for one another." And so the list goes.


But I want to draw your attention to one verse. Carry one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ.

(Gal. 6:2) Life gets hard and the loads can be heavy. How wonderful when someone walks beside us and eases the burden.

From our Wednesday night small groups, I've heard accounts of "burden bearing." One of our covenant partners offered to sit with one of our single adult covenant partners during Sunday worship so that person wouldn't feel isolated. Another person knew of a struggle that a friend was going through and made a point to ask, "How are you doing with that challenge in your life?" Followed by the powerful words of "burden bearing," "I'm praying for you." Another person called me and offered, "Bill, if someone needs financial assistance to attend the Marriage Retreat, call me and it's done!"

Please remember this act of "carrying one another's burdens" is not co-dependence and doing for someone what they need to do for themselves. It is walking with them, acknowledging their challenge, and offering to do some "heavy lifting" in terms of prayer ... of food ... of friendship ... of joining with them on the task ... of being an accountability partner.

In 2017, I was diagnosed with an aggressive cancer that needed to be removed. People in this congregation



stepped up. They laid hands on me and prayed for me (how I needed that). They sent me cards. Several visited me in the hospital ... at Wake Forest! One person who had experienced the same surgery, called me throughout the year just to see how I was doing and to offer me wise counsel.

In short, they "carried my burden." Is it any secret that in 2020 when Jill and I were praying about a place to live ... Florence was on the top of the list and the community of First Presbyterian Church? Join with me in intentionally building PERSONAL CONNECTIONS. And let's have the Time of our Life with one another and Jesus.

Our Ministry Action Plan and its allocation

Facts & Figures

I am using my newsletter article this month to share some of the highlights from 2022 and to provide information about the 2023 Ministry Action Plan. As the chart shows, our giving for 2022 exceeded our ministry expenses. A portion of the surplus has been allocated to support Helping Florence Flourish in 2023.

In February, the Session approved the **2023** *Ministry Action Plan* in the amount of \$ 1,820,268. The Ministry Action Plan is allocated to five areas that make up the church's ministry. Those areas are Worship, Outreach, Discipleship, Fellowship and Administration (Enabling). Worship funds the purchase of music and resources needed by our worship leaders to provide meaningful weekly worship services and special worship opportunities throughout the year. Outreach approximately 32% of our Ministry Action Plan is dedicated to monthly support of national and global missionaries, including the Emerts, Actionnel Fleurisma, Carol Crom and Gray Scott. Additionally, FPC also supports numerous local benevolence agencies — Lighthouse Ministry, House of Hope, Tenacious Grace, Helping Florence Flourish, A Choice to Make, Mercy Medicine and The Naomi Project to name a few. Discipleship includes funding for education and discipleship activities for our covenant partners (children, youth, and adults). This includes our Vacation Bible School, Confirmation, children's ministry, youth ministry activities, adult conferences, and classes. As the name implies Fellowship provides funding for times when our covenant partners come together to share in activities that help connect us as the family of faith (sports teams, concerts, picnics, and seasonal activities). Administration (Enabling) includes funding to cover the operating costs of the church (utilities, building and grounds maintenance, supplies, staff salaries, insurance, office equipment, ECO denominational support). To date, we have received pledges from 150 covenant partners totaling \$1,117,440.00. The average pledge is \$7,450.00 In addition to those who have made a pledge to support the church, we have those who, for various reasons, do not "pledge" but give faithfully in support of the church's ministry and mission. The church leadership and staff appreciate the faithful support of our covenant partners and work hard to be good stewards of this support. If you have not yet made a pledge, you may do so on REALM, the church website (www.florencefirst.org) or by contacting the church office for a pledge card. Thank you!

Do More ONREALM

Several years ago, First Presbyterian Church implemented an ACS database system called REALM. Since then, many covenant partners, staff and leaders have taken advantage of this system to communicate with each other. REALM allows you to update your personal information, follow church announcements, and look up other covenant partners. REALM also allows you to manage your giving to First Presbyterian Church. You can access REALM from your home computer or from your mobile device (phone, tablet, etc.) with RealmConnect. Simply download the Connect app from wherever you get your mobile apps (App Store, Google Play, etc.) If you have questions, contact me or Gwen DuRant. Children prepare for spring art show

As our calendar moves toward the spring, we are busy at the CDC getting ready for our annual CDC Art Show & Sale, which will be held the week of April 17-20, with our parents gathering to purchase the art on Thursday, April 20. The art will be on display earlier that week in the Welcome Center for you to stop by and take a look at what the children have made. Preschool is a wonderful time to explore hands-on art activities. Before a child is 5, they normally do not have the concept of what the finished product will look like. Up until then, it's all about the process. Young children can learn so much from experiencing with different colors of paint and textures. From creating art projects they learn how much glue is too much glue. They stretch their fine and gross motor skills through doing various art techniques. One of the most satisfying things about preschool art work comes when a child proudly exclaims, "I made this all by myself." At First Presbyterian Child Development Center we allow the children to do their own work! After all, no parent wants to see what a teacher can create. For some young children sticking their fingers in a glob of fingerpaint and swirling it around on a piece of paper, is totally disgusting. Other children may choose not only to paint their paper but also paint their fingers. Making a creativity mess in preschool is the most fun of all. For the most part young children love to paint, glue, cut and create!

As spring comes our way we will begin to clear out our preschool garden area and start weeding to get ready for a spring planting. One of our favorites from last year was a variety of sweet peppers that we enjoyed snacking on until early November. The children love to help weed the garden, plant and water. 


