Moscow Seminary

We have recently received the following email from Sasha Tsutserov, which includes an encouraging testimony from Vladimir Bondarev, a student at the Seminary. Vladimir experienced repentance and conversion to faith in Christ through the work of the Holy Spirit, and he decided to begin a life of ministry. He realized his need for training, however, and through the Moscow Seminary he is growing in his knowledge and ministry skills. This testimony is just another reason we are excited to partner with the ministry work of the Moscow Seminary: I am from Ukraine, born and bred – from kindergarten to school to the army. Upon graduation from the Kharkiv Military Academy I was stationed in Irkutsk, Siberia (3,659 miles East of Kyiv, Ukraine). I first heard of the Lord in my early childhood, from my Grandma. She read the Bible to me and taught me to pray. With the Army, it all faded away; I was a rough soldier. But my Mom, the torchbearer in the family, handed me the New Testament. And it worked on me - no more cursing, drinking or smoking! Instead, I was feeding on the Word, breathing in the Spirit, and walking by Faith. Reading the Bible worked opposite ways on me, though. On the one hand, I would find peace and consolation. On the other, I was exposed, pursued by remorse, threaten with divine judgment. As the result, I was torn apart by questions I had no answers. Then missionaries told me the Truth. I repented of my sin, accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior, was discipled and baptized! And there we were - Diana, my wife, and our five kids - all in ministry. I became pastor and teacher at the World Harvest Bible Church & College. I felt so inadequate for the task, though! And so, I enrolled to the Moscow Seminary. I thought the seminary would fill the gaps. Instead, I realized just how little of the Bible I actually knew and how poor my ministry skills really were - Lord have mercy! I had to start it all from scratch, albeit in ministry. But it is going well. My dream is to replicate the seminary at the college with the view to train missionaries to plant churches. Just like in the Bible, "The things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others." (2 Timothy 2:2) - so help me God!


"I made you... I will not forget you. I have swept away your offenses like a cloud, your sins like the morning mist. Return to me, for I have redeemed you.

We are eagerly and expectantly watching to see what the Lord is bringing forth.

The Gift of the Lord

His name was Wayne. But everyone knew him as "Tree." I met him years ago after an Atlanta Hawks pre-season basketball game. A member of the team had invited me and my son to go into the locker room and meet some of the players. We approached this guy sitting on a chair and my friend said, "I'd like you to meet Wayne but everyone knows him as Tree." And when Wayne stood up, I realized his nickname fit. That guy was so tall that I was almost looking at his kneecaps! Wayne "Tree" Rollins was over 7 feet tall. You couldn't overestimate "Tree's" size but how often do you and I make people (and more importantly, their opinions) way TOO BIG. The account of Easter is one dominated by the theme of: people worrying more about what other people think than considering what God desires.

Consider in Mark 11 when the religious leaders engaged Jesus in a battle of wits. Jesus asked these religious "scholars," "What do you believe about John the Baptist?" These powerful leaders balked at answering. Why? Listen to verse 32, "They FEARED the people..." Suddenly these leaders who loved to pontificate about most anything would not state their opinion because the people revered John the Baptist and John the Baptist had revered Jesus Christ!

Later in John 12, we read that many people among the religious leaders of that time ADMIRED Jesus but they shunned from saying anything publicly. (Or as my grandmother would say, "What's the matter? The cat got your tongue?) Why? Why the silence of their convictions??? John 12:42-43 gives the reason for their silence, "...for fear they would be put out of the synagogue; for they loved human praise more than praise from God."

But before we get too "high and mighty" in condemning these religious leaders, let's be honest. How many times have you made decisions in your life because you were afraid of what people may think? How many times have you allowed your choices of what you wear, who you hang around with, where you go, what you say, how you spend money ... to try to fit in or be accepted by people?! Frankly, I've been guilty and so have you.

I've recently been reading a book, "WHEN PEOPLE ARE BIG...And God is small," which has made me



more aware of my need to "fit in" with others ... at the expense of being faithful to God. Following Jesus doesn't mean that you have to be "weird," anti-social, or alienate people. Jesus Christ frees us to be the person that we were created to be and to meet people where they are and to love them where they are. This Lord gives us the gift of being an Ambassador for him as we engage others without using them to validate ourselves! WOW ... what a gift ... the gift of the Lord breaking us free from the prison of "people pleasing" to God honoring.

Where can you start? Two simple suggestions:

- #1 Be aware of the people whom you are with or cross your path. Focus on them (not yourself!).Smile at them. Engage them with the love of Jesus.
- #2 Easter is coming. It is a time when many, many people think about a place to worship on Easter Sunday. Invite them! Your co-workers, your neighbors, your "gym buddies" ... the list is long. Don't be afraid of what they may think, your invitation will please the Lord.

Blessed Easter. Jesus Christ is risen and He makes all the difference in the world.

Columbarium Memory Garden a place to pause

Many of you regularly place poinsettias or lilies in the Sanctuary in memory of a loved one (spouse, child, or parent) at Christmas and Easter. Others place flowers in the sanctuary in memory of a loved one on special days (birthdays, etc.) Many of our covenant partners may not be aware of another, more permanent way to memorialize a beloved family member. In addition to the niches for placement of cremains (ashes), the columbarium features an "In Memoriam" wall. This section is for the remembrance of covenant partners, their spouses, children, as well as the parents of covenant partners, who are deceased and are interred elsewhere. I recently had a conversation with a covenant partner who said, "I wasn't aware that we had this until I started walking the church property for exercise. I sometimes pause in the Columbarium Garden to rest." We had a nice chat, and he said he wanted to have his wife's name added to the wall. We have filled two panels and are working on a third one. Each panel contains eight (8) names, currently we have 3 names meaning that we need 5 more to fill out the panel. The "In Memoriam" is another way to remember those who meant so much and are no longer with us. We'll be glad to assist you with the necessary arrangements. First Presbyterian Church is pleased to be able to offer this option for our covenant partners as part of the end-of-life planning process.

I recently read an article by Thom Rainer in Outreach Magazine titled "7 Surprising Post Pandemic Trends." In the article he says, "It's a tricky thing to find a precise beginning and ending point to a pandemic. We could accept the declaration from the World Health Organization that COVID-19 began on March 11, 2020. The ending date is even more of a challenge to discern. For our purposes, we look at post-pandemic as that time when churches started regathering in person." Rainer lists what he calls "7 surprising trends" in his article, I found three to be of interest as it pertains to our church.

1. Interest in evangelism is increasing. Rainer states, "More churches are responding in obedience to the Great Commission. But we are also aware that Cultural Christians are not returning to church. If a church



wants to reach people, evangelism is a necessity." First Presbyterian Church is not "sitting back" waiting for people to come to us. Through small groups, ministry activities and personal relationships, our covenant partners are reaching out to our community for Christ.

2. Church finances held well longer than expected. The article stated that giving has not declined rapid-

The article stated that giving has not declined rapidly with the cessation of government support and the onset of higher inflation. During the pandemic, when churches were seeing decreased giving, some by as much as 90%, our covenant partners faithfully supported the ministry and mission of the church financially and with their time and talents.

3. Church revitalization has become an accepted discipline and practice much faster than expected.

Before the pandemic "shut things down," our church leaders were beginning to look to the future that God has for us. Now as we are moving out of the shadow of the pandemic, there is a renewed interest on the part of the church leaders (elders, deacons, and staff) to seek God and His plan for this church.

I have observed each of these trends outlined by Thom Ranier unfold before my eyes here at FPC. However, unlike Ranier, I am not surprised. First Presbyterian Church has a long history of leadership in our community. It is no surprise that as we have faced the adversity of the pandemic and related challenges, our covenant partners have risen to the challenge. Thanks be to God for what He has done and continues to do through First Presbyterian Church and each of YOU its covenant partners.

I am thankful to be in ministry with you!
