## MOMENT FOR MISSIONS Mercy Medicine Free Clinic

The Outreach Unit had the privilege of hearing from Brian Lowe, Executive Director of Mercy Medicine, during our recent unit meeting. MMFC shares a rich history with First Presbyterian Church, and this ministry is continuing to provide meaningful service to the community. Brian shared some needs of the ministry, and we ask for your prayers and support for the following areas:

• MMFC is hiring a new bookkeeper, 16-20 hours weekly, to be in the office any days between Monday and Thursday.

- MMFC will be hosting its inaugural clay shooting tournament at Moree's Sportsman's Preserve on September 22, 2023.
- MMFC is in need of more volunteer dentists and oral surgeons to help serve the growing demand for dental care.
- The Darlington Clinic needs a volunteer or paid pharmacy tech on Thursdays from 5 to 7 p.m. to fill prescriptions. Volunteer medical providers, such as MDs, FNPs, PAs and RNs for all three locations

## Living by Grace

Dear Church Family,

There is a flurry of activity as the school year ends and the summer begins. Amidst all that is happening, there are many things worth giving thanks for. The service last Sunday for our high school graduates was stunning. Between the music, the beauty, and most of all the graduates themselves, it was a memorable day. Thank you to all who worked so hard to make it a beautiful service. It was a joy to see their mentors stand behind them at the service – a memorable image that we "stand with them" and support them during college.

While there is much to celebrate, a lot of busy-ness accompanies it all. This time of year in particular it is far too easy to focus on "doing" and "accomplishing." For example, we are busy working on strategic planning for the church – and it is going very well. The Officer Nominating Team is also working very hard. Please keep both in your prayers. They are important to the life of our church.

And, it is easy for us to work so hard that it detracts from taking delight in our Lord. In fact, one of the things that I have been thinking about recently is: "Living by grace." What does that really look like? When we begin the life of faith and we can acknowledge that we are saved by grace. Similarly, at the end of life when we admit our powerlessness we affirm life is all by grace. Yet, in the middle of those two events is the tricky part. We often function as if grace is there for us when we mess up, but most of the time "we got this" all on our own. God, we will let you know if we need help.

And in so doing, striving replaces rest. Performance crowds out praise. Delight is forgotten.

What does "living by grace" look like to you? Do you feel like you see yourself as God sees you? Does service crowd out the fact that God rejoices over you with loud singing (Zephaniah 3:17)?

One way to help us live by grace is by living in meaningful relationships with other Christians. We need other mature believers whom we trust who can reflect



back to us the image of God in us; who can articulate what they see God doing in and through us. Living by grace calls us to be intentional about community: To join a small group. To mentor and be mentored. To share life together remembering that when two or more are gathered in Jesus' name, there He is in their midst.

One of the things I love about being a pastor is sitting down with individuals or couples and hearing what God is doing in their lives. Many times it is true that this counseling happens during either crises or great difficulties; yet, I never find it burdensome. For me, it is a true joy to walk with you during those times. Even though I cannot and do not share what happens during pastoral counseling, I do want to give God thanks today. I have had such meaningful times recently with some of you and it is an honor to be able to speak into each other's lives at such a profound level of what God is doing. Whenever I see guards go down and people expressing hurts and feelings, and have an openness to see God bring His healing touch, it is always a great joy. It is a window into seeing what it means to live by grace.

## **Becoming Like Christ!**

That's right. God's call to YOU (yes, you!) is to become like Him. Listen to the words of God in II Corinthians 3:17-18. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is there is freedom. And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into His likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

Certainly, this goal begins with God. The Holy Spirit inspires and remakes us. But we play a vital role in "becoming like Christ." We are to work out in our daily lives what God is working in.

HOW? That's the critical question. And the answer is by creating healthy habits in our life — SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINES. Or another way of saying it is, following THE WAYS OF JESUS. When you carefully look at the life of Jesus, you notice a "rhythm" to his life. He taught. He actively helped others. He enjoyed times with a close group of followers. He slept. He prayed. He fasted. He walked (everywhere!), and the list goes on.

Lately, I've been spending a lot of time thinking about "the ways of Jesus" and seeking to model his life in the ways in which I live my daily life. It probably doesn't shock you that, by nature, I'm a classic "type A." I enjoy loading my schedule with things to do. I often live "by the clock." Can't wait to get to the next activity and then, move on. Translation — don't copy my pattern. But join me in deliberately slowing down and taking time to be "Present with God ... Present with people."

Closely associated with "speed of life" is the issue of

"time of life." It saddens me when I see the amount of time that people spend on their "devices." I recently read the average guy spends 10,000 hours playing video games by age 21. (For more information check out Philip Zimbardo's research on "The Demise of Guys.") The average American spend 705 hours on social media and 2,737.5 hours glued to the TV (John Mark Comer The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry, p.72).

And here's the "bottom line" — how you spend your days is how you will spend your life! (Anne Lamott)

So here's my advice. You're reading this column in June. Slow down. Put the device away. Enjoy the Lord and people. Walk barefoot (easy for a WV boy to say). Eat some watermelon. Invite the neighbors over. Open up the Bible and read a Psalm or mosey through the book of John. Be still and listen to that voice of God calling in silence, "Welcome home."

If you're interested join me and group of others in a Sunday School class, which will meet at 9 a.m. in the Lawson-Rain Chapel throughout the summer as we study —The Ways of Jesus/Disciplines of the Spirit.


