Dear Church Family,


We have so much to be thankful for. From confirmation to high school graduation to the CDC art show, I see joy throughout this place. The music in worship is also outstanding; it points us toward Ephesians 5, and the New Creation - that we might live in the light and not darkness. It exhorts us to sing and make music in our heart to the Lord, always giving thanks..." To sing and make music is a creative process that orders the mind towards God. It evokes the old saying of Saint Augustine, "To sing is to pray twice." It makes me wonder what tunes might have been used with the earliest songs of the church, such as Ephesians 5:14.

Many things are worth our thanks today that are unfolding and to pray twice about:

First, I am delighted in our confirmands. To give you a snippet: last night the elders asked our sixth-graders about the catechism - and I was amazed at not only how well the confirmands were learning the faith, but also how much fun they simply were to be around! They are learning and growing. The session literally gathered around them and prayed for them. The mentors have poured themselves into our confirmands for months. Thank you! It is cause for the heart to sing.

Second, we are working on strategic planning for the church. It is exciting to be in a place in which we are simply asking the Lord what He wants to show us about the future He has for us. Women, you are invited into this conversation

I have called you FRIENDS. (words of Jesus in John 15:15)

Last night I finished meeting with some outstanding small group leaders who have been instrumental in leading many of you in our Wednesday evening "small group study of The Lord's Prayer." The overwhelming consensus was, "Bill, so many people in our group told us how much that they enjoyed getting to know some other folks better."

After the meeting I walked to my car and gazed up to a beautiful steeple aglow with a setting sun and uttered a prayer, "Thank you, Lord, for a wonderful experience of people being with one another and with You."

I wasn't surprised by the message of the small group leaders because we were simply embracing a God-designed reality — we were created by the Lord for relationships.

Men, hear me. You and I need one another. And far too often, we fall into a cultural pattern of trying to do life by ourselves. Studies reveal that most men over the age of 35 have no authentic friends! A confirmed "loner" by the name of C.S. Lewis for years lived a socially isolated life. Then, he met Jesus Christ and his view of people changed. Listen to his words:

"My happiest hours are spent with three or four old friends tramping together ... and sitting up until the wee hours ... there's no sound I like better than laughter." Then he concluded, "Friendship is the greatest of worldly goods ... sacrifice almost everything you have to live where you can be near your friends."

Guys (and gals) we are better when we are together with one another and the Lord. Let me encourage you (and in some cases, "push you") to allow yourself to move closer to other Christ-Following men. If you want some help in doing so, please contact me.

Faithful Investments Change Lives

For most of us, the words invest, investing or investments are associated with money and financial matters. The primary definition of invest is: "to expend money with the expectation of achieving a profit or material result by putting it into financial plans, shares, or property, or by using it to develop a commercial venture." So, it is no wonder that when we hear the word invest, our thoughts immediately go to things such as the stock market, financial advisors, 401k and retirement accounts. The word invest has a secondary definition that is: "to provide or endow someone or something with (a particular quality or attribute). I want to look at this definition as it pertains to the ministry of First Presbyterian Church.

Sunday, May 7, will be Confirmation Sunday. On that day, we will recognize and welcome nine Confirmands as covenant partners into our church. Since last August this group of sixth-graders has been involved in the confirmation process of our church, which includes catechism class and a 13-week mentoring process, where the confirmands are paired with an adult covenant partner (mentor). The mentor is not someone who has all the answers but rather someone who is willing to share his/her journey of faith with another person who is an apprentice in the faith. Through this process, the catechism leaders and mentors have invested in the lives of these young people. I have had the privilege to be a mentor to three different confirmands over the past few years. Many of you have mentored confirmands through the years will understand that the return on investment is watching a young person grow and mature in their faith and understanding of God.

The catechism leaders and mentors are only a few of the people who have invested in the lives of the confirmands. When a child is baptized into our congregation, the covenant partners are asked if they will nurture and support the child as they grow in faith. Nursery workers, Sunday School teachers, VBS leaders, Wednesday night study leaders and others have invested in the lives of these young people along the way.

First Presbyterian Church is blessed with covenant partners who understand and are involved in the secondary definition of investing both in our church and in the community. Through leading a small group,



teaching a Sunday School class, GriefShare ministry or involvement in one of the many benevolence agencies we support, our covenant partners are investing in the lives of people. The return on these investments will not show up on a quarterly earnings statement in an investment portfolio; instead, it will be found in changed lives.

There is a tendency to think of stewardship strictly in terms of money. However, when it comes to Christian stewardship, it is far more than money — it's your life! Aspects of Christian stewardship is life lived in Christ, the life of discipleship. It takes seriously the psalmist's affirmation that "the earth is the Lord's and all that is in it" (Ps. 24:1). Faithful stewards are always growing. They never graduate from the school of discipleship. Christ calls his disciples to be always on the cutting edge of life. As we are nurtured in our faith, we grow in our understanding of what it means to have "the mind of Christ." As our senses and sensibilities are stimulated by the Holy Spirit, we grow as stewards and mature as obedient disciples. We truly have far more resources given to us by God than we even realize. So, in what ways are you stewarding the resources (time, talent, and treasure) given to you? Non
