To Whom the Kingdom Belongs

Dear Church Family,

The summer has begun with such a fine start: Vacation Bible School this year was beautiful. There was such a sweet, peaceful spirit throughout the entire week. It is a powerful thing to see so many different members of our community join together to nurture and worship with our children. I was so pleased to see how well the children participated in worship even by repeatedly speaking up in front of the group, and how they were such a part of worship the Sunday following VBS to top everything off.

My heart was warmed when I saw glimpses into how parents had clearly been talking to their children about Jesus at home. All in all, I hope the kids had as much fun as I did! A big thank you to all who made this happen – and for Kelly and Laura Anne leading the way.

Our society values children so much that it is often lost on us how powerful it was when Jesus spoke to us about children in the scriptures. When Jesus said, "Let the little children come unto me because the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these" (Mark 10), this was profoundly counter-cultural. Back in Jesus' day, by and large, adults simply wanted children to grow up so that they could participate in work and help provide for the household. Moreover, mortality rates were so high it is shocking to know that many parents frequently chose not to bond with their children until they were about 5 years old, when the chance of death had decreased (this was more common among pagans than Jews). So when Jesus gives such a warm reception to children who have a kingdom, this would take everyone aback for children were not in charge.

What a powerful image of grace: we receive from Jesus what we do not earn; it is purely a gift given out of love.

That is why every time we teach our children at Sunday school, walk with our sixth-graders through confirmation, or simply befriend them – we can do so because we know that this is how God sees us. He looks at us as His children, looking at us through the waters of baptism, and we receive His goodness, grace and love. This



is why it has been said that to the degree that we see ourselves as a Child of God is the degree to which we understand the Gospel. Raising our children to know Jesus is the most important thing, yet it is not always easy. How can we as a church support you?

On another note, we will soon be reading Isaiah together for our next sermon series. While I realize Paul's Letter to the Romans has been called the "5th Gospel," I frequently want to apply that term to Isaiah. Isaiah 40-55 is an incredibly beautiful poem that proclaims our incomparable God who saves us and rescues according to His plan. A plan that climaxes when the Messiah comes. It takes time for us to digest that following Jesus is so much more than "going to heaven when I die" - and the older I get and the more I understand, it simply puts me in awe not simply of the coherence, the scope, the beauty of the Gospel - but even more so the glorious nature of our loving God who made it.

Isaiah prophesies about Jesus dying for our sins so that we could be brought near to God, be His friend, and even have the Kingdom of Heaven belong to us. What a glorious God.



Be Filled by the Spirit

What does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit (lose) his SOUL? (Mk 8:36)

That's a question that we avoid only at our own peril. Let me ask you a question, "HOW IS YOUR SOUL?" Your soul is that part of you that integrates your will, your thoughts, and your body. Your soul is the most important part of YOU. Your soul is like the CPU (Central Processing Unit) of your computer. It brings everything together, integrates it, and enables it to function.

Yet, you and I get so caught up in our work, our responsibilities, our relationships, our hobbies, and countless other activities that our soul gets neglected and starved. Feed your soul!! How? First by asking the Holy Spirit to fill you, energize you, and equip you... every day. As the Bible says, "Be not drunk with wine wherein is excess but BE FILLED BY THE SPIR-IT." (Eph 5:18) This is not a "One and Done Phenomena." The emphasis is upon being filled by the Holy Spirit over and over and over again.

Then allow God to speak to you through His Word. Every morning (or evening) open the Bible, read a short section, and pay attention to key words or phrases which intersect with your life. The more often you do this, the more you will "hear" God speaking to you. Find a daily devotion book to help you focus on a scripture. If you need help finding one, call me.

Finally go out and serve someone. WinShape Camp is right on our doorstep. Our Children's Ministry area and our Youth Ministry area could use people who want to help our "next generations." Invite your neighbor(s) over and get to know them better. I could go on and on. Again, call me if you want some direction. (I love telling people what to do!!)

Men of First Presbyterian, I'm bolding these words and I'm asking you to plan on attending our Men's Retreat. We are going to focus on "Becoming a Man of God." I promise you a weekend of fun, fellowship, and building up your faith (your soul). The date is August 18-20 at Hickory Knob State Park. I dream of First Presbyterian Florence being a people who love God and others by their HEADS, who love God and others by their HEARTS, and who love God and others by their HANDS. Or to put it another way, Souls on fire by God and for God.

Toward a Healthier Church

Stewardship is about more than money. But clearly monetary giving is the starting point. In the Old Testament we read: "Each of you must bring a gift in proportion to the way the LORD your God has blessed you." (Deuteronomy 16:17)

Each year First Presbyterian Church asks our covenant partners to make a pledge to financially support the ministry and mission of the church in our community and around the world through our Ministry Action Plan. The **2023 Ministry Action Plan** approved by the Session totaled \$1.84 million. That translates to a weekly need of \$ 35,520.00 to fully fund the ministries of First Presbyterian Church for 2023, which includes support to our missionaries (Emerts, Carol Crom, Gray Scott and others), as well as providing support to the local agencies (House of Hope, Lighthouse Ministries, Mercy Medicine, Tenacious Grace, A Choice to Make, etc.) Thus far in 2023, our actual weekly receipts are averaging \$30,594.00. The chart below shows a snapshot of our collective giving for the first six months of 2023 (as of 6/26/23).

Despite the deficit, First Presbyterian Church is current in our support of our missionaries. Additionally, our staff and ministry leaders are to be commended for being good stewards of what has been given as they continue to plan and implement ministry activities.
