The Vision: Discipleship

Dear Church Family,

For a number of months, the strategic planning team has been hard at work (Patricia Fast, Laura Marechal, Robert Moore, Bill Cain and myself). We have been sharing our work with all the church officers during our monthly joint meetings. On July 22, Rocky and Carolyn Pearce graciously hosted all the officers at their farm for a strategic planning retreat as well. As spiritual leaders, we are not seeking a "good idea" and then asking the Lord to bless it; instead, we began with what does the Lord want? What is God doing so

The Vision Statement - what we believe God led us to write:

that we can hop on board? As Henri Nouwen puts it,

"The mystery of leadership ... means to be led."

"First Presbyterian Church Florence will be a community of Christ Followers committed to being disciples and making disciples in the way of Jesus."

This is precisely what Jesus commanded us to do in Matthew 28: "Go make disciples of all nations..." Our home denomination of ECO is also a tremendous gift in this regard. It provides many ways to equip us in being disciples and in making disciples. If you'd like a taste of what ECO has to offer, please take a day to attend the National Gathering at First Presbyterian Church of Greenville, Jan 29-30. I have signed up.

The second step after writing the vision statement naturally would be: "How will we get there?" What are the repeatable actions we can take to be and make disciples? I love how our ECO Synod Executive Dana Allin sums it up in his book Simple Discipleship: Since Jesus said to love God with all of our heart, mind, soul, and strength and to love our neighbor as ourself, the two greatest commands, then perhaps this is the essence of being a disciple. Dana uses the alliteration of "head, heart, hands" as a memorable way to say "heart, mind, soul and strength."

Simple Discipleship was read by all the church officers and I appreciate how the book is how it can show anyone how to take their next concrete step forward

in their own personal life of discipleship. Simple Discipleship goes hand-in-hand with our recently adopted **Mission Statement:**

"First Presbyterian Florence is called to love God and people with our Head, our Heart, and our Hands."

- Loving God with our "Head." Lifelong learners who are shaped and renewed daily by God's Word.
- Loving God with our "Heart." Relationships are vital and life sustaining. We are connected to the Lord and in life-giving community with other Christ Followers. Worship is a primary means to sustain and strengthen our relationship to the Lord God.
- Loving God with our "Hands." Every Christ Follower is engaged in ministry using their God-given gifts. More to come later on strategic planning. As we move forward in "being disciples and making disciples."

Finally, I have had a number of comments on the "Joshua Jar" from one of my recent children's lessons. Simply put, imagine a cookie jar that has the words "Joshua Jar" painted on it. It has a few pretty stones inside with a note on which is written:

"In the Book of Joshua, God leads his covenant people from the deserts of Sinai into the promised land of Canaan, from aimless wandering to a place of purposeful living. Before God's people could enter the land of Canaan they had to pass through the Jordan River - not over nor around it. God stopped the river's flow to remind the people of their past redemption out of Egypt and the future grace that would be theirs in the land. The Lord commanded Joshua to lead the people in storing stones of remembrance. It was as if they would tell anyone who asked, 'God miraculously brought us in his providence and goodness, and we've got the stones to prove it.'

Use this jar and the stones to store up the memory of God's faithfulness and grace to you – not just for you but also for your children."

A Joshua Jar is something that stones are added to over time, and it is to be taken out and enjoyed periodically to recall and celebrate the faithfulness of God with the next generation. It makes a great gift for a couple who is about to be married.


Recently, I walked into a local restaurant and you could not miss a sign on each table which boldly asked the question, "Is it ever acceptable to cut in line?" Underneath the question rested the answer, "Absolutely ... just take your seat, get your phone ... and order LIKE THE BOSS YOU ARE." The message was clear, "You are the boss and you are in control. Get what you want, when you want it." That, my friend, is a lie and unfortunately, it's a lie that many of us live by.

It's a novel idea for a restaurant. It's horrible advice for how we are to live each day. Jesus follows his question about Lordship with a wise directive, "These words I speak to you are not mere additions to your life, homeowner improvements to your standard of living. They are foundation words, words to build a life on." (Lk 6:47 The Message translation)

Many of you this month have made some sacrificial choices to serve OTHERS through one of the Serve-FLO events or suggestions. You have sacrificially cared for others and directed your attention to them and not yourself. God bless you ... that's allowing the Lordship of Jesus to guide.

This month many of you will be challenged to consider how Jesus wants us to use money. Many of you will choose to take the advice of Jesus and offer a pledge of the money that God has given to you to the ministry of the Lord through First Presbyterian. That's wonderful — you're learning about the Lordship of Jesus over your finances.

But don't let your giving be limited to money. You are gifted with specific talents that God can use in so many



ways here. I just heard about several young men who are teaching our elementary children in our Sunday School. I'm so proud of those men who understand the Lordship of Jesus and are giving of their time and abilities. Consider finding ONE area in our congregational life to serve the Lord. (If you need help, give me a call and let's talk.)

The sooner you realize that you are not "the Boss," the better. The more that we allow the Lordship of Jesus and the words of Jesus to control how we use money and time; how we view other people, how we understand our sexuality; how we lead; and how we serve; we are "like the person who built their house on a foundation of rock. When a flood came, the torrent struck the house but could not shake it because it was well built."

Jesus Christ is the Lord. His plan works, not mine nor yours.

Faithful support key to year end giving

Due to the increasing bulk mail postage rates, contribution statements will be emailed to all covenant partners and guests who have contributed to the mission and ministry of First Presbyterian Church through September 30, 2023. The statements will be sent to the email we have on file in REALM. If we do not have an email address on file, a printed statement will be mailed. In order to carry out the Ministry Action Plan set forth by our pastors, program staff and the various ministry units of the Session, we need to receive contributions of \$35,520.00 per week. The chart below shows a snapshot of our collective giving for the first nine months of 2023.

And I sense that this feeling of awe and gratitude is a natural religious impulse for many people. The simple foundational belief that God has given to us and in gratitude we give back to God and others is at the core of a sound theology of giving." 


