### A COVENANT ORDER OF EVANGELICAL PRESBYTERIANS

December 28, 2023

Dear Covenant Partners of First Presbyterian Church Florence,

The new year comes with new beginnings and new challenges, some easier than others. Your church has just worked through a complex and crucial change in Senior Pastor leadership, and we can only imagine what you must be feeling. Is this a good change? Is this a problematic change? What does this all mean? Even change that helps us move in a positive direction can be hard.

First, we assure you that this change came after a thoughtful and deliberate initiative by your Session. Second, they are tired, and they need your support and encouragement as they take the next steps in preparing for new leadership. Third, trust in the Lord. This is His church, and your faith is in Him.

We wanted to explain the recent process of formally dissolving the Senior Pastor relationship. In our denomination, ECO, a congregation meets to vote or 'call' a minister and extend a job offer. Once it is time to dissolve that call, a congregational meeting is not required when a mutually satisfactory parting is agreed upon between the Pastor and the Session. Thankfully, your Session and Dr. Evans were able to come to an agreement that was suitable after he offered his resignation.

When a pastor leaves, it is usually a delicate and difficult situation. We ask that covenant partners not place former pastors in an awkward position by requesting them as your 'friend' to perform the duties of a pastor (funerals, baptisms, weddings). We ask that you instead work with the Transitional Pastor and then the new Pastor. Doing so will allow them to develop relationships and to become established in the congregation. This also gives both the congregation and the departing pastor time to work through any grief which might exist in a pastoral transition. Additionally, the Presbytery asks that departing pastors not participate in the life and worship of the church they are leaving for at least one full year beyond the installation of the new pastor who assumes each departing pastor's role.

The next vital step for First Florence is to engage a Certified Transitional Pastor (CTP). Under ECO polity, the CTP is hired by the Session and has a contract for one year that is renewable or extendable until the church is prepared to call its next Senior Pastor. The Session has already established a search team for the CTP consisting of Jim Dameron, Jayne Boswell, and Ryon Watkins. What is a CTP and how is a CTP different from an Interim? An Interim Pastor keeps things running until a new pastor is found but a CTP collaborates with the officers, staff members, and congregation to assess the current and true health of the church. The CTP will ask questions, listen, and begin to strategize the plan of care for restoration and healing. The CTP will work with all of you to see what needs attention and possible adjustment, what can be addressed now versus later, what needs to bandaged up, and what needs immediate surgery.

The three of us have all experienced pastoral change on multiple occasions. Some of it has been simple and expected, and some has been complicated and even traumatic. Churches within our Presbytery as well as churches outside our denomination have undergone all manner of pastoral change, so you are

not unique in this regard. Yet we have seen the value of using the Certified Transitional Pastor model for navigating such change in a healthy manner. Saxe Gotha Presbyterian Church in Lexington currently has a CTP, and a few other churches in our Presbytery have also had one during the past few years. As you prepare to have one of your own, we strongly encourage you to do the following: Please pray for each other, and especially for those church members who are upset and/or confused and may be looking for someone to blame. Please reach out to the people in the congregation, those you know and those you do not know, and ask them "How are you really doing?" and then listen to their story. If you may be considering leaving your First Florence church family, please pray again and ask the Lord to guide your steps and actions before doing anything as a gut reaction. Your church needs you now more than ever. When the Certified Transitional Pastor arrives and asks for help, please respond and get involved.

The Ministry Partnership Team (MPT) works with churches in all stages and situations, not only those in conflict. The entire Ministry Partnership Team is praying for First Florence and is committed to working and walking with the church family of First Florence not just in the immediate future, but in the years to come. We look forward to the day when we can rejoice with you as the Lord brings healing and joy, and as you once again experience long term stability after your next Senior Pastor is settled among you.

### Continue to work out your own salvation ... for it is God who works in you. (Phil 2:12-13)

### A Special Prayer Walk


