A Message from Actionnel Fleurisma

Greetings, Friends and Partners in God's ministry!

Many of you have seen the news and have shared your concern for Haiti. I wanted to give you an update. There are two things I can truly tell you all about:

- 1 "Let's not allow anything to prevent us from praising our Lord" was the topic of our sermon Sunday, March 3. Psalm 34. Church looks stronger and worshippers seem to be more regularly attending services.
- 2 In spite of the fact that all schools in Gonaïves, Saint-Marc, Port Au Prince, and other parts of the country have been closed since December, the schools at OFCB have been gathering every day from Monday through Saturday. The elementary schools at each campus have not missed a day. There was one week in February where the 7th, 8th, 10th, and 11th graders missed because we were not able to get teachers to the main campus to teach their classes.

In times where there is a shortage of everything, the folks in Bayonnais have stood together supporting one another more deeply. We are also thankful for your love and support. The international airports in the country have been shut down since March 7. We hope to see them open again soon so that Yolande and I can travel to the U.S. as planned to visit with you and your churches.

I have been very reserved or quiet regarding what the country of Haiti has been dealing with. We have chosen to stay silent and reserved because we have been confused. We have been trying to understand how brothers and sisters could use destruction as a means to solve political issues. We are all in the same boat, living in the same country. We still do not understand and probably, we will not ever. ...

What is the hope for Haiti?

1- Evangelism. 2- Education. 3- Job creation. 4- A stable government with strong leadership.



From the Transitional Pastor Search Team

What is a Transitional Pastor Search Team? Why was it formed? How was it formed?

In early January 2024 in compliance with ECO policy, the Session formed a Transitional Pastor Search Team to find a Certified Transitional Pastor or, CTP. The search team consists of three Ruling Elders: Jayne Boswell, Jim Dameron, and Ryon Watkins. This team was charged with the responsibility of finding a Certified Transitional Pastor to serve as Senior Pastor/Head of Staff while we search for a permanent Senior Pastor/ Head of Staff. Through the Office of Ecclesiastical Support, our denomination provides a service to all ECO churches, which includes an in-depth training program for retired pastors who are interested in becoming certified in transitional ministry. Believing this is a

specialized area of church ministry, ECO designed a certification program to assist churches in various circumstances of transition usually involving the replacement of a Sr Pastor/Head of Staff.

In January, using ECO's resources, we began to review potential CTP candidates. After a lengthy process of reviews, virtual and in person interviews and a lot of prayer, we are pleased to present Dr. Stuart Bond as our Interim Certified Transitional Pastor. In addition to being a gifted preacher and teacher, Dr. Bond is experienced in all areas of transitional ministry. You can see more about him in the article above. His first Sunday leading worship will be Sunday, April 7. Please join us in welcoming and agreeing to pray for Dr. Bond as he serves us during this time of transition.

Transition is a part of life

One of the things I enjoyed about living in Louisville, Kentucky, when I was attending seminary was that the four seasons were clearly defined (Winter, Spring, Summer, and Fall). Each season lasted a number of weeks and there was usually a gradual transition from one to the other. It's unlike seasons in South Carolina, where we can have all four in one day: Winter at 6 a.m., Spring at 10 a.m., Summer at 2 p.m. and Fall around 4:30 p.m.! Just as the seasons transition, we all experience transition in our lives, sometimes those transitions are gradual and sometimes they are sudden.

In thinking about transition, I was recently reminded of a quote by Chuck Swindoll: "Life is 10% what happens to you and 90% how you react to it." Swindoll is an author and an educator. He emphasizes the importance of our attitudes in life, and how each morning when we wake up, we have a choice as to which attitude we will choose to embody that day. For Swindoll, attitudes are "more important than facts," "more important than the past, than education, than money, than circumstances, than failures, than successes." They are more important than what people think, say, or do, "than appearance, giftedness, or skill." According to Swindoll, attitude can "make or break a company ... a church ... a home." These words are a reminder to us as our church continues through this time of transition.

As important as Swindoll's words may be, God's promise found in Jeremiah 29:11 is of far greater importance.

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

(Jeremiah 29:11)

As we look to the future each of us, individually and corporately as First Presbyterian Church, needs to hear and claim the promises of God.

Don't Be a Victim

Safety on our campus is a priority. We want to ensure that the children in our CDC, our covenant partners and the many guests that visit our church for worship and other activities are as safe as possible. We want to make our campus safer while maintaining an open and inviting atmosphere for our covenant partners and guests. There are things that each of us can do to enhance safety on our campus. Let me encourage you to remember the following basic safety tips:

- 1 Lock your car and do not leave valuables (purses, phones, iPads, etc.) in plain sight.
- 2 When leaving the building, particularly after dark, practice the "buddy system."
- 3 If you are the last person leaving, be sure that the door closes and locks behind you. This is particularly important if you are in the building outside of normal hours (weekends and evenings).
- 4 Do not block doors open. There are certain doors that will remain locked in order to control access to our buildings. Most of these doors are in remote areas of the building and are not "regular" entrances. Your cooperation with this is appreciated.
- 5 Familiarize yourself with the location of AED (automated external defibrillator device) and first aid kits. They are located outside the sanctuary near the flower room; outside the kitchen near the CLC and in the upstairs Children's hallway.
- 6 If you see something that "doesn't look right", let someone know about it (an usher, custodian, staff member, etc.) Additionally, we have an off-duty Florence County Sheriff's deputy on campus each Sunday morning and Wednesday evening who is willing and able to assist you if you see something that "doesn't look right."

All Our Hope

My mother had one sister named Hope, and she was a favorite aunt. She was good to me and was like a second mother. One of my favorite memories was going on picnics with my mother, Aunt Hope and my cousin. Every time I read the word hope in the Bible I think of her.

My favorite contemporary hymn is *All My Hope Is In Jesus* by Crowder. The chorus of the song expresses how I feel about Jesus being my Savior and Lord.

All my hope is in Jesus Thank God my yestersay's gone, All my sins are forgiven, I've been washed by the blood.

The words for hope occur over 1,100 times in the Old and New Testaments. The main thought of Lent is our hope is in the resurrection of Jesus. That is a promise for each person who listens to and believes in the saving power of Jesus. My hope is for eternal life as a result of my resurrection. The concept of hope is basic to living as a follower of Jesus. Psalm 42 and 43 are one poem in the Hebrew Scriptures. It creates an atmosphere of hope. The theme of the Psalm is the thirsting and seeking for God. In the midst of distress and the feeling of God being absent, the writer repeats this thought three times:

Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God, for I shall again praise him, my help and my God (Psalm 42:5, 42:11, and Psalm 43:5).

Hope is the emotion that replaces despair and fear. Hope is closely aligned to Faith. Faith overcomes doubt and assures us that God loves and shows mercy to all humanity. The Creator God is our Father, our Abba which is best translated as Daddy.

In his letters, Paul gives Christians hope in the resurrection of Jesus. In Romans 8:24, Paul defines hope as the patience to wait for what we cannot see. I believe he is speaking about our hope in the resurrection of Jesus. In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul seeks to answer their question about what happens at death. Their friends and loved ones are dying and Jesus has not returned. The 15th chapter of I Corinthians is Paul's explanation of the Christian's hope in believing because Jesus is resurrected that all the faithful will be resurrected.

If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died (I Corinthians 15:19-20).

Late in the writings of the New Testament, the letter to Timothy has the words of Paul describing Christ Jesus as "our hope."

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the command of God our Savior and of Christ Jesus our hope (I Timothy 1:1).

The total ministry and eternal promise of Jesus is our hope for eternal life. A follower of Jesus must spend their entire earthly life seeking and thirsting for God through Jesus. It is the New Testament's witness to Jesus as the Christ or Messiah which gives the clearest view of the nature of God.

The image of a deer longing for flowing streams is a beautiful symbol of the way a person seeks to be filled with God. We not only seek to know God but we are to seek to allow God to be in us. The LORD God desires to fill us with the Holy Spirit. What a wonderful truth of life! When we long for or when we seek God: God comes to us in Jesus and fills us with the Holy Spirit. All our hope is in Jesus because our hope is fulfilled as the Holy Spirit in us witnesses to Jesus as the Messiah.
