Congregational Meeting to be held

A congregational meeting will be held on May 19, 2024, at 10:40 a.m. in the sanctuary for the purpose of electing four Covenant Partners to serve on the Officer Nominating Committee (ONC). Members of the ONC will decide who might be the Lord's persons for the respective roles of deacon and elder. They then prayerfully ask these people to consider serving and bring that slate for the Congregation to affirm.

Prior to nominating a Covenant Partner, please confirm his/her willingness to serve on the ONC. Please review ECO Polity regarding the roles of Deacons and Elders. Here are the roles for each as described in our Constitution:

- 2.02 Elders are given authority and responsibility, along with pastors, to oversee the spiritual health of the congregation as well as the congregation's faithfulness to God's mission. Elders may also be asked to preach and teach. Elders shall be elected by the congregation.
- 2.03 The Ministry of Deacons Ordinarily, the biblical office of deacon shall be utilized by the congregation. Deacons lead ministries that nurture fellowship and caregiving within and beyond the congregation. Deacons may also be asked to preach and teach. The congregation shall determine the manner in which they are selected for service. The session shall oversee and direct the ministry of the deacons.

Summer Worship: Starting Sunday, May 26, there will be one worship service at 10 a.m. on Sundays throughout the summer. The style of service will alternate weekly; the two services will return Sunday, September 8. Children in 3K through fifth grade will have Sunday School at 9 a.m. during June and August; some adult classes will meet, as well.
